

Volunteer Job Description / Opportunities

Volunteers are usually needed during traditional business hours (Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm). Special projects or activities may require evening or weekend hours.

This is in no way an exhaustive list of the possibilities. We have compiled this listing as a way to provide examples of different types of activities so that on a case-by-case basis we can determine the best use of each volunteer's unique talents.

Expectations for All Volunteers:

- Demonstrate knowledge of domestic violence, an understanding of related issues, and a commitment to ending violence against women.
- Demonstrate ability to develop and maintain cooperative relations with a diversity of individuals.
- Pass a satisfactory criminal background check.
- Maintain an accurate record of all services and activities.
- Adhere to all volunteer policies.

Responsibilities by Opportunity:

Clerical

• Filing, data entry, printing/creating files, etc.

Donation Food Drives

- Collecting various items such as:
 - o Food
 - Personal hygiene items
 - Bed/bath linens
 - Cleaning supplies
 - Birthday goodies
 - Seasonal items
 - o Etc.

Crisis Line

• Answering the 24-hour crisis line and documenting calls accordingly.

Life Skills / Parenting Class Facilitator

- Facilitate small group education sessions on relevant topics as scheduled.
- Develop presentations using personal knowledge or provided curriculum.
- This may also include leading self-care or hobby type activities such as arts & crafts, cooking, gardening, or exercise.

Children's Activities

- Read a story to the children in the shelter.
- Plan and facilitate a related activity such as craft, snack, or game.
- Homework assistance

Childcare Provider

- Provide childcare while mothers are participating in case management activities.
- Interactive play is preferred.
- Maintain safety of children while in care.
- Maintain cleanliness of play areas with assistance of the children.

Adult Activities

- Assists with planning various activities such as:
 - Spa days
 - Movie nights
 - Cooking projects
 - Health and fitness
 - Gardening

Housekeeping and/or Maintenance

- Assist with general shelter maintenance and repairs according to skill level.
- Assist with facility projects such as installing shelves, etc. according to skill level.
- Landscaping
- General and/or deep cleaning projects at the shelter or outreach office

Donation Assistant / Thrift Store Assistant

- Assist with the management of incoming donations to include sorting, distribution, and documentation.
- Assist with the maintenance of donation organization and storage.
- Sorting, stocking, cleaning, setting displays, etc.

Community Awareness Volunteer

- Assist with the planning and implementation of awareness activities within the community.
 - o Various event periods include:
 - Domestic Violence Awareness Month
 - Sexual Assault Awareness Month
 - Teen Dating Awareness Month
- Co-facilitate community meetings, awareness campaigns, events.
- This may include events, educational programs, or marketing displays.

The following is a list of project ideas that could be implemented as an individual or a group.

• Create Welcome to NGMCN Baskets

- o Gift baskets or tote bags filled with encouraging notes and items to be given to families when they enter the shelter.
- Suggested contents (adult): journal, candy, word puzzle books, hand lotion, manicure sets, playing cards
- Suggested contents (child): coloring book, crayons, card games, small toys, chapstick, candy

• Create Housewarming Baskets

- o Buckets, baskets, or other containers filled with encouraging notes and items to be given to families as they leave shelter for independent housing.
- o Suggested contents: cleaning supplies, paper products, kitchen tools, pantry items

• Create Birthday Party kits (or be available to put on a party)

- o Bag (or box) filled with items to be used for a child's birthday.
- Suggested contents: boxed cake mix, canned frosting, party plates, cups, & napkins, Kool-Aid mix, balloons, party favors

• Create Back to School Bags

Backpacks filled with school supplies

• Plan a Family Activity (involve mothers and children)

- Suggestions
 - Make Your Own Pizza Party bring makings for pizza and help clients put together their own personal pizzas
 - Cookie Decorating Party bring makings for cookies and help clients bake and decorate cookies
 - Arts & Crafts Party bring supplies and help clients create
 - Holiday / Occasion Themed Party (Easter, Back-to-School, etc.)

Host a Family Outing

- Suggestions
 - Fishing Trip
 - Pool Party
 - Fruit Picking
 - Painting

• Facilitate Children's Story Time

- o Read a story to the children in shelter.
- o Plan and facilitate a related activity such as craft, snack, or game.

- Prepare / bring a meal for the shelter residents.
 - Option: Prepare casseroles or similar dishes that can be frozen and reheated as needed.
- Facilitate a donation drive
 - See standard wish list
- Various Organization / Maintenance Projects (as needed)
 - o Paint a room
 - O Clean out / organize a storage room / building
